ORDER


The merit selection panel shall submit a report to the court pursuant to § 420.30.40 of the above-cited regulations.

The panel has received written notification of the restriction in §420.30.20 (d) which states that in order for a former merit selection panel member to be considered for a magistrate judge position, one year must have elapsed between the application deadline and service on the panel. The Judicial Conference Committee on the Administration of the Magistrate Judges System is authorized to grant waivers to this provision on an individual case basis.

Applicants should refrain from contacting individual panel members directly. Any comments or inquiries related to the panel or the process should be directed to the Clerk of Court, at KSD_MeritSelection@ksd.uscourts.gov, rather than to any of the panel members. We appreciate adherence to this request to preserve the independent work of the panel. To further assure that the panel functions independently, the Court has instructed the panel members that the identities of the applicants and the contents of the panel deliberations must remain strictly confidential, unless waived.
